Noah

Walked with God (Gen. 6:9)
A preacher of righteousness (2 Peter 2:5)
Saved a few, while most of the world was destroyed (1 Peter 3:20; Matt. 7:13-14)
His "baptism" is an example to us (1 Peter 3:20-21)

Abraham

Obedient (e.g., Gen. 12, 17, 22)
Left his country and family (Gen. 12:1-3)
Blessed all nations (Gal. 3)
A deliverer (Gen. 14)
Interceded (Gen. 18)
Did not receive the promises in full in his lifetime (Heb. 11:8-16; Heb. 12:2)

Isaac

His birth was miraculous and predicted (Gen. 17:15-21)
The "only begotten son" (Heb. 11:17)
Was as good as dead for 3 days, traveling to Moriah (Gen. 22)
Carried the wood upon which he would be sacrificed
"God will provide for Himself the lamb" (John 1:29, 36)
Was offered by his father on the mountains of Moriah
Was raised up from the dead (figuratively, Heb. 11:19)
A man of peace (Gen. 26)

Jacob

Received promises from God: "In you and in your seed all the families of the earth shall be blessed." (Gen. 28:14) God was with him and blessed others on account of him (Gen. 28:15)

Joseph

Was favored by his father (Gen. 37:3)
His reign was predicted (Gen. 37:5-11)
His brothers didn't believe him (Gen. 37:8; John 7:5))
Left home seeking his brethren's welfare (Gen. 37:12-14)
His brothers persecuted him out of envy (Gen. 37:18ff; Acts 7:9; Matt. 27:18)
Enjoyed God's presence (Gen. 39:2, 21, 23)
Served faithfully over his master's house (Gen. 39:3-6)
Resisted temptation (Gen. 39:10, 12)
Suffered wrongfully (Gen. 39:20; 40:15; 1 Peter 2:21-23)
Predicted the future (Gen. 40)
Two fellow prisoners suffered very different fates (Gen. 40)
Forgave his family (Gen. 45:4-8)
Saved his family (Gen. 45:7)
Was exalted to "second-in-command" at age 30 (Gen. 41:37-46)
All nations came to him (Gen. 42:1-5; 46:31; Isaiah 2:1-4)
