### **Spirituality versus Religiosity**

Are you a *religious* person? Are you a *spiritual* person?

A person can be **religious without being spiritual**.

Witness: The Pharisees. (Matthew 23) The carnal-minded Corinthians. (1 Corinthians 3)

## Because of hypocrites and carnal-minded church-goers, the general opinion is that ALL religious people are non-spiritual.

#### And we know that Jesus calls us to be spiritual.

Jesus speaks about three actions of spirituality in the Sermon on the Mount: (Matthew 6:1-18)

- 1. **Charitable deeds** (our interaction with others and willingness to help)
- 2. **Prayer** (our communication with God and trust in Him)
- 3. **Fasting** (our control over ourselves and our desires)

It is true that a person can be **spiritual without being religious** (that is, doing those three activities, but not going to church or even belonging to a church). And non-church-going people love to justify their lifestyle!

# So, general opinion is that being spiritual is enough, especially if "all religious people are non-spiritual, and therefore stand condemned."

#### But Jesus calls us to be both spiritual AND religious.

The three actions mentioned above which demonstrate a person's spirituality could be called "private religion" (or, "secret religion," or, "closet religion," the idea in **Matthew 6:6**).

Then there is "public religion," the actions visible to others that are dictated by one's spirituality. Jesus asks us to make a public confession that He is the Christ, the Son of God, (Romans 10:9-10; Matthew 10:32; Acts 8:37; etc.) and be baptized for the forgiveness of our sins. (Mark 16:16; Acts 2:38; Romans 6:1-4; etc.) He prescribes all the acts of obedience and faithfulness that have to do with Christian life (going to church, Hebrews 10:24-25; helping others, Galatians 6:1-10; etc.).

Jesus, Himself, was both spiritual and religious. He fasted severely and prayed often. (Matthew 4:1-11; Luke 6:12; etc.) Concerning His "public religion," notice Jesus' example of worshipping publicly (Luke 4:16; Hebrews 2:10-13), and His long record of public preaching and good deeds, as summed up in Acts 10:36-38.

So, are you *spiritual*? Are you *religious*? God wants you to be *both*!
